methodologies used in those studies are used as models for subsequent studies or others to repeat similar studies in different setting or for different purposes, such as probability-based assessment tool for determining maternal death causes, C-survey to estimate immunization coverage, real time observation of care deliveries at hospitals, use of communication means (phone, e-mail, fax, mail) to collect data in national survey, and time and motion studies in health centres.
